I am with the Trench Maintenance Cor again. We have had bad weather this time but the billet is dry and we had yesterday off so we are not feeling much wrong with us. We are not allowed to send souvenirs home but I may be able to buy something suitable as a present. I think the Easter card was a very nice one, I lost one of my numerals, so I had to get another pair.

Yesterday was a splendid day, and so we cleaned and dried our clothes and blankets. I am well and I hope you are all well. Percy has till November.

One man who was in the same tent as I was at Cosham and who came out with me had had two abdominal operations when young. He was accepted in England but after being attached to an Ambulance out here he could not stand the strain and was discharged.
