I've just done eight days up the line. We had a fairly quite time altogether. Bullets came near once or twice but I'm quite safe and sound. I slept in the dug-out. The weather was wet during the last day or two otherwise we could not complain.

I'm hoping to see a Wolverton man one of these days. Do you know if there are any in the 1st Northampton's as they are near.

I think I receive all your letters. I got the paper and book safely this week.

It is snowing here again.

There are preparations being made for heavy fighting. I see that German aircraft have again visited England.
