Meeting to discuss the future loan of this railway to  
LBR  
20<sup>th</sup> December. 1838

*Aylesbury Railway.* - A special General Meeting of the Shareholders was held at the White Hart Inn, Aylesbury, on Wednesday, 20<sup>th</sup> ult. for the purpose of considering an arrangement proposed with the London and Birmingham Company as to the future occupation and loan of the Aylesbury line of the railway. The Secretary read a letter from the London and Birmingham Railway company, offering to make an arrangement with the Aylesbury Company, for a lease of their line of railway by the London and Birmingham Company, at a rental of £2,500 a-year, for five years. The Chairman having briefly stated the objects of the meeting, and several of the shareholders having expressed concurrence in the proposed arrangement, a resolution was unanimously carried, empowering and recommending the Directors to accept the offer of the London and Birmingham Company and the meeting was adjourned, after passing a vote of thanks to the Chairman for his able conduct in the chair, and attention to the interests of the company.
