The Garners eldest child, William John R Garner married Mabel in 1925. William died in 1942 (circumstances not recorded) and was buried in St Mary's Churchyard, Bletchley. The younger daughter, Nora, married John William Jones in 1935. He was her cousin (the son of William Henry Jones, her mother's younger brother). John William followed in his father's footsteps and joined the Royal Navy. He died at sea on active service in the War (1943) and is commemorated by his name being inscribed on the War Memorial situated in Church Green Road near to St Mary's Church.
